Terms and Conditions

- 1. Categories open to males and females aged 18 years and over. Proof of ID may be required.
- 2. Contestants may only enter this competition in their own private capacity and not on behalf of a third party, including any commercial enterprise.
- 3. Contestants must nominate during the designated time, and be present for heats/preliminary judging to be eligible for final judging round.
- 4. Contestants understand that any competition images remain the property of the BRC, and can be used by BRC and associated sponsors for marketing and publicity use.
- 5. Prizes are not transferable, exchangeable, or redeemable for cash.
- 6. The judging panel's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 7. Contestants must not in any way disparage or make derogatory comments in any form (whether verbally, electronically or otherwise) about the BRC, Sponsors, Judges, the Competition, or any other Contestants at any time.
- 8. If a Contestant in in breach of any terms and conditions, BRC may disqualify the Contestant.

Lady of the Day Criteria

- a) Timeless style and originality
- b) Suitability of the outfit for individual, climate, and season
- c) Appropriateness of the outfit for a day at the races (including hem length)
- d) Attention to detail and coordination of accessories
- e) Understanding and interpretation of the current fashion trends
- f) Incorporation of the race day theme where applicable
- g) Overall grooming and deportment

*Classic: Traditional, timeless race attire. Gloves essential. Shoulders covered. Longer hem.

*Contemporary: Avant-garde, pushes the boundaries of traditional racewear. Modern fabrics and accessories (sequins, bold prints etc). Exposed shoulders, shorter hems acceptable. Gloves optional.

Gentleman of the Day Criteria

- a) Style and originality
- b) Suitability of the outfit for individual, climate, and season
- c) Fit and tailoring
- d) Attention to detail and coordination of accessories (for example cufflinks, pocket square, lapel flower, hat, shoes, belt etc)
- e) Understanding and interpretation of the current fashion trends
- f) Incorporation of the race day theme where applicable
- g) Overall grooming and deportment

Best Millinery Criteria

- a) Style and originality
- b) Suitability of millinery for individual, climate, and season
- c) Workmanship and wearability
- d) Understanding and interpretation of the current millinery trends
- e) Coordination of millinery with outfit
- f) Incorporation of the race day theme where applicable
